QUIZZING METHODS



If you've attended any offline Quiz then you'd know, it's one of the most exciting experiences. Although the pandemic shifted everything online, Quizzing included, the methods and process remained almost the same.

We'll guide you through the process of offline and online quizzing both in this extended section.

• *Offline Quizzing*

Offline quizzes primarily consist of two rounds. Prelims and a final round.

Prelims are usually conducted like a pen and paper test where the Quiz Master presents the question and the participants are supposed to write the answers on a sheet of paper.

Once this is done, a cutoff is decided and the top 6 or 8 teams qualify for the finals round.

Finals are conducted in a completely different manner in college quizzing. There are usually two methods that are followed. The Pounce and Bounce system. These are basically the two methods of answering questions in a quiz. Let us take a look at what is meant by these terms.

- Bounce is simply 'Direct and Pass'. The question is passed on to the next team if the team whose bounce it is fails to answer the question.

- Pounce is a chance to attempt out of turn. If you know the answer to a question but it's not your chance, you can pounce by simply raising your hand. This way, you get to answer the questions secretly to the QM before the team direct answers the question on the bounce. This way you can also score extra points if the QM has such a provision.

• *Online Quizzing*

Online Quizzing also consists of two rounds. Prelims and a final round.

- In online mode, the prelims round is conducted either via Google forms or Google forms and zoom. In the Google forms method, a certain number of questions with a specified time limit is given to the participants. In the Google forms and Zoom method, the QM presents the question while the participants write the answers in the Google form.

- For the finals round, the top 6-8 teams are shortlisted and a WhatsApp group is created with all the teams separately along with the QM. The participants have to join a zoom/ Gmeet where they can answer the bounce questions. The Whatsapp groups are made for pouncing the answers. If any team knows the answer before their turn, they can simply write the answer in the group tagging the QM.

These are the basic methods that are followed while conducting quizzes. It might sound a bit complicated on paper but it's really fun and exciting in practice.

BEGINNER'S GUIDE



To become a quizzer, you don't have to wait to be a part of a society, and neither is it only for nerds. Anyone can become a quizzer with a bit of practice. **You only have to read, listen or watch stuff you're interested in**, such as sports, politics, business, science and tech, pop culture, etc. Absorb as much information as you can in the process.

"Curiosity is the mother of invention" – Plato.

If you want to learn or become better at quizzing, you should **participate in Quiz competitions**. Most colleges at the University of Delhi and other Universities conduct quizzes of various genres throughout the year.

If you want to become a part of our college's quizzing society **Quintessence**, you can **participate in the audition to join us**. We conduct auditions every semester to select new members.

Quizzing is far more than what you see on KBC or other TV shows; it's much more exciting and challenging.

To make you familiar with the format of the questions, here's an example:–

QUIZ GENRES



A GUIDE TO QUESTION FRAMING

If you want to explore all aspects of Quizzing, 'question framing' counts as a significant part. There is no particular format. There are various approaches to it and in the end, it's always the choice of the Quiz Master (QM) which method he/she wants to use while framing a question.

Here are a few basic tips you can use while framing a question.

- Always check the authenticity of the source you're framing the question from. Try to go for at least two authentic sources.
- Wikipedia, Reddit, and SlideShare are some of the best sources to look for random information, trivia, facts, and questions. But remember, always double-check.
- Other interesting alternative sources include youtube videos, comedy show segments, IMDB pages, current fads, memes, punny titles, and etymologies.
- Funda-based questions can always be the right choice.
- The question should contain ample clues so that participants can piece them together and find the context for the answer. But, at the same time, it should not be a giveaway.
- A few things that can be used as hints are When(timeline), Where(geographical entities), quotes, descriptions, stats, etc.
- The difficulty level should be ascertained based on the audience, genre, and availability of the question.
- Trending news and memes can also make up for good questions and always try to look out for some aspects overlooked.
- Questions don't have to be difficult all the time. Your audience should enjoy the challenge of figuring it out.
- Lastly, QMing can be an expressive medium. Try to be interactive and approachable. You may give verbal hints which are not mentioned in the question but can be helpful to figure out the answer.

Few Donts while preparing a question:

- Do not frame one-liner questions until circumstances follow.
- Do not go for questions with unverified or no source.
- Don't use too much heavy text in the questions unless it seems necessary.
- Don't go for too many questions of the same genre. Keep a balanced ratio between Indian and Western questions.
- Do not rely on facts to make up a good question. Explore for further trivia and fundae.

There still remain many tips on Question framing, but these were the most basic ones.

The Experience
