#### Particulars of organization, functions and duties

#### **Vision Statement**

Zakir Husain Delhi College stands steadfast as a champion of some basic values which have acquired greater relevance in contemporary times. Education in this college is not a mere pursuit for information but a holistic development of character with a commitment to building a strong knowledge base with scientific temperament.

# **Objective**

The main objective of the college is academic excellence along with an all round development of personality so as to make our students responsible citizens with a sensitive concern for justice and a sense for fairness.

# **Brief History**:

Zakir Husain Delhi College is the oldest college of North India. It was established at Ajmeri Gate in the late 18<sup>th</sup> century during the reign of the Emperor Aurangzeb as *Madarasa Ghaziuddin*, became famous as an oriental college for education in Literature, Science and Arts. Later on, it came to be known as Anglo Arabic College, and then as Delhi College in 1824 and remained so till 1975 when it was renamed after Dr. Zakir Husain, a renowned educationist and the distinguished former President of India. In 1925 the college was affiliated with the University of Delhi. Whether for women's education or the building of scientific temperament, as also for instituting translations, vernacular languages and English, this college has played a vital role.

The college was shifted to its present location in two installments in 1986 and 1991, a location which geographically and symbolically unites Old Delhi with New Delhi, merging old traditions with a constant striving towards progress and modernity.

Today, it is one of the renowned institutions of Delhi University with over 3300 students and a 151 member faculty (permanent).

# Location:

It is centrally located opposite Ram Lila Ground, on Jawahar Lal Nehru Marg, New Delhi 110002.

# **Unique Features:**

- Undergraduate classes for 19 disciplines.
- Vibrant departments of *modern and classical Indian languages* such as Hindi, English, Bengali, Arabic, Persian, Urdu and Sanskrit.
- Science departments include Botany, Zoology, Chemistry, Mathematics, Physics and Electronics.
- Over one *hundred and fifty faculty members*, many distinguished scholars.
- *Library and Book Bank:* The College has a spacious and a well-stocked library possessing about 1,14,000 books. It also has the largest Book Bank in Delhi University.
- **Faculty Mentor Scheme**: The college introduced the 'faculty mentor scheme' with effect since 2007 2008 session. Under this scheme, each student admitted to the college is attached with one faculty member who remains his/her guide and counselor for his/her entire period of stay in the college. Through this scheme, a close *Gurukul*-like personal relationship is developed between the *Guru* and the *Shishya*.
- College brings out *Nine Magazines* annually of Bengali, Commerce, English, Hindi, Science, Urdu,
- Pol Science, Psychology, & Srishti (Nature & Environment Society)

- **Green and Environment Friendly:** College has a Vermi Compost unit which converts the biodegradable waste of the college canteen in to manure. It contributes in keeping play field and garden green.
- *Health*: Campus is *Tobacoo*, *Paan* and *Gutkha* free. Healthy non-carbonated drinks are available in the canteen.
- **Equal Opportunity:** The composite culture of the college provides equal opportunity of growth to students from various regions, religions and socio-economic origins.
- Annual Lectures: College organizes two series of annual lectures, the Zakir Husain Memorial Lecture and the Delhi College Lecture. Distinguished scholars, activists and educationists are invited each year to speak on issues of contemporary relevance.
- Delhi College Archives: College has its own archives which has a collection of documents and other materials related to the history of the College. Some text books prepared and /or used during the 19<sup>th</sup> century for instruction in mathematics, history, geography, literature etc., are also on display. The archives also contain secondary sources and books relating to the intellectual ferment in the Delhi region during the 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> centuries.


