History of Three Centuries

The illustrious voyage of Zakir Husain Delhi College embarked as the Oriental College for Literature, Science, and Art. In 1825, the esteemed establishment underwent a transformation and was bestowed the name Delhi College under the governance of the British East India Company. As progress unfurled, the college introduced an innovative curriculum in 1828, encompassing the realms of English language, literature, and science. In doing so, Delhi College stood as a trailblazer, bridging the gap between traditional knowledge systems and the emergence of English education in the nation. This constructive interplay between oriental and western intellectual traditions flourished, especially prior to the 1857 revolt.

Addressing the needs of the city, Delhi College fostered a remarkably diverse cultural ambiance, revering composite culture and nurturing a spirit of mutual accommodation. Gradually, it became a hub of vibrant scientific and literary intellectual endeavors, heralding the dawn of the 'Delhi Renaissance' in the early twentieth century. In 1842, the college relocated to Dara Shikoh's library near Kashmiri Gate, and in 1843, the Delhi College Translation Society was established as an integral part of the institution.

However, following the tumultuous events of the 1857 revolt, during which the college fell prey to the ravages of revolutionaries, the institution faced a series of trials and tribulations. The British authorities, in response, closed down the college. From 1864 to 1871, a new era commenced with the introduction of intermediate Bachelor of Arts and Master of Arts classes. Nevertheless, in 1877, the British government transferred the Delhi Oriental College to Lahore, leading to its reconstitution as the Anglo-Arabic Intermediate College in 1924.

In 1925, the college gained affiliation with Delhi University, subsequently becoming one of its esteemed constituent degree colleges in 1929. Unfortunately, the college became a target of attacks and arson during the partition, but miraculously, the library and office records were salvaged. With the relentless support of Dr. Zakir Husain and other stalwarts, Delhi College experienced a revival in 1948. In recognition of his profound contributions to the institution, the college was rightfully renamed Dr. Zakir Husain College in 1975.

A new chapter in the college's history unfolded in 1986, with its relocation to the present-day campus on Jawaharlal Nehru Marg. Significantly, this geographical shift, situated beyond the Turkman Gate, symbolically amalgamated Old Delhi with New Delhi, harmoniously merging age-old traditions with progress and modernity.

In July 2010, the Zakir Husain Memorial Trust, under the chairmanship of the esteemed Prime Minister Dr. Manmohan Singh, unanimously resolved to rename the college as Zakir Husain Delhi College. Throughout its three-century odyssey, one enduring constant has been the institution's unwavering commitment to knowledge dissemination and the cultivation of a scientific temperament, all while championing secular and progressive values.

It organised an event on World Rivers Day on 16th September 2022. Three exciting 'What if'- A situation-based narration, Poster Making competition and Meme Making competition were held. A book collection drive was held from 6 October to 6 November 2022 and the books were donated to 'Gram Pustakalaya' (mission rural library) which is led by Mr. Ramveer Tanwar, the library man of India. On 8th February 2023, a speedball-making workshop was organised by the society. It was led by Mr Mohit Relan, the founder of the Yeh Mera Gaon initiative and co-founder of NGO Say Earth. In collaboration with NARGIS- The Botanical Society of Zakir Husain Delhi College, Aranya organised a lecture on "Exploring the Extremes: Journey of a Botanist" on 3rd November 2022. The lecture was delivered by Prof. Dinabandhu Sahoo - the first Indian student to explore Antarctica during 1987-88. The volunteers from Aranya attended Ganga Utsav – The River Festival, which was celebrated on 4th November 2022 under The National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG), Department of Water Resources, River Development and Ganga Rejuvenation, Ministry of Jal Shakti, at Major Dhyan Chand Stadium in New Delhi in two sessions. A conventional debate competition was held on 14th November 2022 on "Human Extinction Will be a Blessing for Nature". Dhwanik- The Indian Music Society in collaboration with Aranya kickstarted Aaghaz with two amazing performances. A slideshow presentation of a montage of various events organised by the society - Nest-making Workshop, and Pankhudi-the annual fest of Aranya followed by a discussion with anthropologist Mr Anas Khan. On 27th January 2023, the workshop on the cultivation technique of Pleurotus mushroom was organised by Nargis.

The Botanical Society of Zakir Husain Delhi College in collaboration with Aranya. The annual fest Pankhudi was organised on the 16th and 17th of February 2023. Various competitions like the singing competition, Mandala Art, Nukkad Natak competition, Paperless Artistry Competition, and COP-ZHDC commenced on the agenda- deliberation on eco-capitalism to achieve sustainable development goals. 4. Azadi Ka Amrit Mahaotsav

For Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav (AKAM) - an initiative of the Government of India's Ministry of Education, to celebrate 75 years of our Independence - inter-college singing, slogan writing, and essay writing competitions were organised in July with participation from 150 students across 20 colleges of the University of Delhi. The Arts and Culture Society organised intra-college collage and rangoli competitions. On 8th August 2022, World University Service's Delhi University chapter, in collaboration with Saksham Indraprastha, organised an eye check-up camp at the college auditorium foyer with more than 180 participants. On 13th August 2022, as part of the Har Ghar Tiranga programme, a 'Tiranga Yatra', facilitated by the NSS Unit of the college was held with flag hoisting by Principal Prof. Narendra Singh along with honourable Chief Guest Sh. Suresh Jain, National Organising Secretary, Bharat Vikas Parishad. The library committee organised a week-long book exhibition displaying books on India's Independence struggle. The Garden and Greening committee planted three trees, Neem, Bargad and Peepal called "Triveni" on the college campus. The Arts and Culture Society organised a Cultural Programme. The lighting of the lamp with Sanskrit Shlokas and Saraswati Vandana was followed by felicitation of the Guest of Honour Prof. Sushma Yadav, Prof. Anil Aneja, Chairman of Governing Body, and Prof. Amit Bardhan, Treasurer, Governing Body. This was followed by the college Taranaana, and a Bharatnatyam and Kathak-Jugalabandi by the student members of Nrityathi, the classical dance society. The music society, Dhwanik presented patriotic group songs and Aman, the theatre society staged a play titled, "Gagan Damama Bajiyo" on the life of Shaheed Bhagat Singh. The members of the Western dance society Dhanak performed a group dance commemorating the contribution of Captain Vikram Batra, the Paramvir chakra awardee, during the 1999 Kargil war. Suchitra, the fine arts society exhibited the hues of patriotism through their painting exhibition. A selfie-point-Har Ghar Tiranga also witnessed participation. The students and staff gathered in the college and recounted the stories that they had heard of the partition and what some of their forefathers had to undergo during the partition. A two-minute silence was observed, followed by a Silent March in the college to offer respect to the lives that were lost in 1947.



5. Bengali Literary Society

On the 23rd of April, 2022, the students and teachers of the Bengali Literary Society held the 9th Gopa Dey Memorial (online) on a very interesting topic, Terracotta Temples of Bengal and India. The Speakers invited were Prof. Shreela Basu, Visva-Bharati and the Chair was Prof. Gopa Datta, the Ex-Vice-chancellor of Gour-Banga University. Rabindra Divas' was celebrated on the occasion of Rabindranath Tagore's 161st Birth Anniversary on this same day. An essay writing competition was held on the 11th of August 2022, by the students of the Bengali Literary Society and the theme was 'Svadhinatar Pachattar Bachhor' (75 years of Independence). In the month of May, the students of the previous two Final years (2019-20, 2020-21) and Final year students of 2021-22 were invited to a farewell function by the Department, and a very colourful cultural program was organized by the junior students. This year the Bengali Literary Society organised its Fresher's Welcome on the 9th of February where songs, recitations, dances and speeches were performed by and for the incoming students. The 10th Gopa Dey Memorial Lecture was held on 28th April 2023 on the topic: Agni Puja in Indus-valley Civilization. Slides were presented of the Puja seats from excavation sites and relics were shown physically to show the difference between the Agni-worship cult of the Vedic period and the Harappan people. The Speaker invited was Mr. Sandipani Bhattacharya who is the Deputy Director of Amity Group of Institutions. Prof. Amitava Chakraborty, Dean, of Art's Faculty and Head of the MIL&LS Department chaired the session. The farewell function was held on 1st May 2023 with colourful festivities.



6. B. R. Ambedkar Centre

On 24th May 2022 and 3rd June 2022, the centre organised two Student Seminars Methodology and Ethics of Writing workshops. Three review sessions were also held. The resource person of these was Dr Santhosh J., Assistant Professor, Department of Political Science. On 30th June 2022, a Student Seminar on 'Castes in India: their Mechanism, Genesis and Development' and 'Annihilation of Caste' was organised. Dr Harish Wankhede, Assistant Professor, Centre for Political Studies, School of Social Sciences, Jawaharlal Nehru University, was the keynote speaker of the seminar. Students sang 'Saheb Mere Bhim Rao' followed by a video presentation by the media cell of the Centre. The centre celebrated Constitution Day on 25th November by organising a lecture delivered by Dr Arvind Kumar of Jamia Milia Islamia. A photography competition, quiz competition, and an orientation programme for a new batch of students were also held. The Centre organised a special lecture on 31st January 2023, with Dr Jadumani Mahand, Assistant Professor of Political Science, Jindal Law School, OP Jindal Global University, speaking on 'Ambedkar's Constitutionalism as a Democratic Theory'. The second edition of the inter-college annual fest, 'Manuski' was organised, and it started with a speech by Dr Santhosh J., followed by a debate competition. A quiz competition on Babasaheb and Phule was organised in collaboration with Quintessence, the Quiz Society. Apart from these events, the centre organises regular reading and discussion sessions on Dr B.R. Ambedkar.

7. Botany (Nargis)

Nargis – the Botanical Society, held its inaugural session on 11th July 2022, and the inaugural address was delivered by Dr M. Aslam Parvaiz, Former Vice Chancellor, of Maulana Azad National Urdu University and Former Principal, of Zakir Husain Delhi College. The title of the talk was “Plants – Our Teachers and Spiritual Guide”. A photography competition on “The Bounties of Nature” was organized during the botanical excursion to McLeod Ganj from 24th -27th September 2022. On 13th September 2022. A talk followed by a poster-making competition was organised on the International Day for the Preservation of Ozone Layer. The talk was delivered by Prof. Preetam Singh, Emeritus Professor, Oxford Brookes University, U.K. on, “The Current Global Economic and Environmental Crisis”. On 3rd November 2023, a lecture by Prof. Dinbandhoo Sahoo, the first Indian student to visit Antarctica, Professor, Department of Botany, DU Director, Center for Himalayan Studies on “Exploring the Extremes: Journey of a Botanist” was organised in collaboration with Aranya- The Nature and Environment Society under the aegis of IQAC. On 14th November 2022, a poster exhibition on “The Inside Stories of the Plant Body” followed by “A Nukkad Natak on Sensitivity Towards Plants” was held. This nukkad natak was also performed at two different locations at Connaught Place, New Delhi on 26th November 2022. 
15. History Society- Udanta

With college going offline, sports activities were resumed by organizing practice sessions and trials to induct players to complete the required number of players in a team. This year two new sports Kho-Kho and Kabaddi were introduced by popular demand of students and through trials by respective coaches, team members were selected and set into regular practice.

The Basketball team participated in several tournaments: SYNAPSE organized by MAMC, SURGE by Shiv Nadar University, LSR sports tournament, BAREFOOT by Bhim Rao University, YMCA sports tournament, secured 3rd position in SPLASH organized by LHMC and were ousted in the quarterfinals in FOYS by SRCC and SPARDHA by Amity University.

The College Chess team was victorious in many tournaments, securing 1st position in the Chess individual event at 'APARAJIT' tournament organised by Symbiosis Law School, 2nd position in the mixed team category in BMW Heroes' Challenge, 1st position at Chess warfare by DTU in the individual category, third position in chess individual at LSR, and put up commendable efforts in various tournaments like 'SURGE' by Shiv Nadar University, sports tournaments of Miranda House, SRCC, Maitreyi College. It is a matter of great pride for us that one of our students was selected for the Delhi University chess team and played North Zone Inter-University tournament and another student secured second position in the National level CA Students Chess Competition held at Vadodara.

The Cricket team participated in an inter-college knockout at Rajdhani College, won 2 matches at Maharshi Premier League, NOIDA, Swami Dayanand Saraswati tournament at PGDAV, SAMAGRAH sports society festival of DME, and T-20 intercollege tournament organized by SGND Khalsa college. The college football team secured 4th position in the Reliance Youth Sports football league bagged 2nd position in AEG Sports Fest Athleema and showed commendable performance in tournaments like BAREFOOT by Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar College, Foys by SRCC, and JMC Sports Fest and reached semi-finals. Our team played exquisitely at LSR, Amity, and Bennett University sports fest.

Our Judo team members won a lot of accolades for their performance, played magnificently, and won two gold and one silver medal at the All-India championship Tong-il-Mood-Do 2023, gold medals in many tournaments like All-India Inter-University, Kanpur-2022, Khelo India University, Bangalore-2022, 10th district Karate championship & selection-2022, Kumite-Open district karate do championship-2022. The players put up a praiseworthy performance and won a silver medal in Judo at LSR and the Open district karate championship in Karate. One of the team members won the bronze medal at Khelo India dus-ka-dum 2023, LSR College Kurash, and Mata Sundri College 2023. One of our students secured 7th place in Senior National Lucknow 2022, 5th place in National Games 2022 Gujarat, and 5th place in All India Inter-University Punjab 2023. Our players participated in the 38th Delhi State Judo Championship and one of the players secured 2nd place. Our team players also participated in All-India Inter-University Championship.

Kho-Kho was introduced in college and the team, in its maiden effort, entered the semi-final round at FOYS by SRCC and Inter-College knockout. Kabaddi, also introduced in college, made a mark in sports activities of the college by securing 3rd position in matches organized by Major Dhayanchand Association and Ghajipur district. Our men's team played exceptionally well and secured 2nd position at BITS Pilani. 1st position in Men's single at Desportivos by LNMIIT Jaipur, LSR and Athleema by AEG; 3rd position in Men's single at JMC. 1st position in mixed doubles at LSR and Athleema by AEG. One of the players secured bronze in Women's singles and doubles at Athleema by AEG.

One of our students got selected for North Zone Men's team after trials for the North Zone Inter University Volleyball tournament. Facilities

Library and Book Bank

The Mirza Mehmood Beg Library is a comprehensively air-conditioned facility boasting a total collection of approximately 115,000 books. The library operates on the Open Access System, offering convenient accessibility to its resources. Two Reading Halls are available, each accommodating up to 100 individuals. Additionally, the library provides two teachers' enclosures with a combined seating capacity of 20, one of which serves as an Enabling Unit for Visually and Print Disabled individuals.

In addition to its diverse collection, the library houses a special room dedicated to the Delhi College Archives, housing valuable historical documents pertaining to the College's rich history. Furthermore, it boasts an impressive collection of rare books and manuscripts. Apart from textbooks and materials relevant to academic needs, the library subscribes to prominent magazines, leisure books, competitive exam resources, and general awareness materials.

The library also features a Book Bank, housing a wealth of around 12,500 books. This service offers students the opportunity to access required textbooks for the entire academic session, subject to timely application upon notification. In line with modern trends, the library strives to provide convenient services to both students and staff by employing popular social media tools. The ultimate aim is to facilitate a seamless and user-friendly experience for all library patrons.



Computer Labs/ Multimedia Lab

The College has three well-equipped computer labs which cater to the curriculum requirements and course needs of the students of all streams. The college is connected to Delhi University through WAN.

Audio Visual Room

Audio Visual room in the Science Block is equipped with facilities like a public address system, overhead projector, and LCD projector. Educational film shows, lectures, and other similar events are organized, giving the students ample opportunities to participate in cocurricular and extra-curricular activities.

Seminar Room

The seminar room is equipped with an audio system and projection facilities. Lectures of prominent people, seminars, and discussions are organized here.

Faculty Mentor Scheme

The college introduced the faculty mentor scheme in the academic session 2007-08. Under this scheme, each student admitted to the college is attached to one faculty member who would be their guide and counsellor for their entire period of stay in the college. Students are encouraged to discuss any issues or problems – academic or personal, with their respective faculty mentors. Like the older days of “Gurukul,” this scheme aims to build a good student-teacher relationship and solve the day-to-day or any long-term problems the students may face in college or in their personal life.



College Canteen

The college has a fully functional canteen surrounded by lush greenery creating a more aesthetic environment. It caters to healthy, wholesome, and pure vegetarian delicious delicacies with a vast variety menu at reasonable prices. It ensures the daily nutritional requirements of both students and staff. The quality of food items and even the ingredients used are also checked and monitored regularly.

Common Rooms

The college has two common rooms separate for girls and boys. The common rooms are spacious and have 50 girls and 25 boys seating capacity. The rooms have comfortable furniture, an attached washroom, a purified drinking water facility, and an intercom facility. The common room provides a recreational space to socialize among students of different departments, quality discussions, co-curricular activities, talk and relax during free time. Facilities for playing indoor games like chess and table tennis are also provided. Girls' association activities are also conducted in the Girls' common room.

Medico-Counselling Room

There is a Medico-Counselling Room adjacent to the college library. It is well-equipped with a first-aid facility. Doctors, along with a medical assistant, physiotherapist, and psychiatrist, are available on campus from Monday to Friday on a part-time basis. Students can avail of this facility as and when required.

Bank

The College Campus houses a Canara Bank Extension branch for institutional financial transactions. The bank facility caters to the needs of students and staff members for maintaining a savings account with a minimum balance. Students can open individual accounts in the bank for easy processing of scholarships and other financial assistance. This fully computerized bank facility offers world-class services and gives the students and staff on campus ease in handling their money.

Photocopy-cum- Stationery Shop

The campus has a stationery store in the science block that provides basic supplies, stationery, and xerox facilities at reasonable prices.

Playground

The college houses a well-maintained sports ground for outdoor games like cricket and soccer. Students can benefit from enrolling in various sports activities, training sessions, and tournaments. The facility of different indoor and outdoor games is available to every student on a timetable basis. Proper dress code, accessories, and discipline are mandatory for availing of the sports facility.

ICT Enabled Rooms

Ordinance XV-C Prohibition of Ragging

(Complete details are available on UNIVERSITY OF DELHI website)

As per Ordinance XV-C of the University of Delhi and more recently as per Supreme Court order, ragging in any form is strictly prohibited within the premises of College/ Department/ Institution and any part of University of Delhi system as well as on public transport and elsewhere.

Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance. Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students and includes individual or collective acts or practices which:

- a. involves physical assault or threat of use of physical force;
- b. violates the status, dignity and honour of women students;
- c. violates the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to scheduled castes and tribes/OBC;
- d. expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem.
- e. entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behavior.

Action shall be taken in accordance with the rules laid down by the College/University of Delhi against those who violate either of the above-mentioned ordinances.

Scholarships and Awards

Mirza Mahmood Beg Memorial Scholarship

Three scholarships of the value of Rs. 1400 each are awarded annually to the undergraduates who secure the highest percentage of marks in the college in the final year of University examination in:

- (1) Humanities and Social Sciences stream including Psychology but excluding Mathematics
- (2) Science stream including B.A. & B.Sc. (Hons.) courses in Mathematics
- (3) Commerce stream

Sri Narain Nigam Memorial Scholarship

There are three scholarships for the following categories of students obtaining the highest percentage of marks in the college in the second year of the University examination,

Ved Kumar Gupta Memorial Scholarship

One scholarship of Rs. 1100 to a student securing the highest percentage of marks in college at the second year B.A. (Hons.) University examination in Political Science.

Kumar Shubham Memorial Scholarship

Four scholarships for the following categories of II-year students who obtain the highest percentage of marks in the following courses:

- (1) Rs. 700 for a student in B.A. (Hons.) Psychology
- (2) Rs. 350 for a student in Humanities & Social Sciences stream excluding psychology and B.A. (Hons.) Mathematics
- (3) Rs. 350 for a student in the Science stream, including B.A./B.Sc. (Hons.) courses in Mathematics
- (4) Rs. 350 for a Commerce Student

All India Entrance Scholarships

The University of Delhi conducts a competitive examination in the month of October for awarding scholarships of the value of Rs. 250 per month for three years. The firstyear students admitted to Bachelor with Honors Courses may appear for this examination. They may contact examination Branch VII, University of Delhi, on any working day between 9.30 a.m. and 12.30 p.m. after 1st August.

No student shall be awarded two scholarships in one academic session. In the case of overlapping, the decision of the Awards Committee shall be final.

Mrs. Harjinder Grover Memorial Award

Late Dr. (Mrs.) Harjinder Grover was a distinguished faculty member of the department of botany, Zakir Husain Delhi College. Dr. Grover was known for her strong command over the subject especially the embryology of plants and is still fondly remembered in the department for her kind and gentle demeanor. Botany Department awards a cash prize of Rs.1000/- each to second year toppers and Rs.600/- each to first year toppers from B.Sc. (Hons.) Botany and B.Sc. Life Sciences. The prize money is funded by the "Harjinder Grover Endowment Fund," which was instituted in her memory by her family and the laboratory staff of the department who graciously contributed to the fund an amount of money that she had left behind for them.

Shobha and Ravindra Nath Kaul Memorial Prize

A memorial prize was instituted in 2021, by Prof. Ratnum Kaul Wattal, Department of Botany in the memory of her parents. Out of the interest generated on the seed money an amount of Rs 2500/- each is given to the topper of B. Sc. (Hons) Botany and B. Sc life Science 3rd year every year. The cash prize is accompanied with a certificate.

S.P. Suri Memorial Award

Chemistry Department awards a medal, book, and certificate to the students securing first position in B.Sc. (Hons.) in Chemistry I, II & III years in the college. The award is instituted in the memory of the Late Mr. S.P. Suri, who established the Chemistry Department in the College and was on its faculty till 1987.

M.K. Gupta Proficiency Award Chemistry Department also gives proficiency awards to the students of B.Sc. (Hons.) Chemistry I, II, & III year who secure I, II, and III positions in the college. The award was instituted by Late Dr. M. K. Gupta, an Associate Professor in the Chemistry Department.

Gopa Dey Memorial Award

Bengali department has started the Gopa Dey Memorial Award of Rs. 1500/, Rs. 1000/- and Rs. 500/- each for B.A. (Hons.) students in Bengali II and III years who secure first, second & third positions in the college. The department will also award Rs. 1000/- to the B.A. (Hons.) student in Bengali II/III year for remarkable performance in sports and cultural activities.

Vidya Devi Education Fund

A fund of Rs. 5,51,000/- was created in 2015 for the benefit of students of the College belonging to economically weaker sections of the society by Mr. Ashok Kumar Sharma, Department of Commerce, in the name of his mother. 60% of the interest accrued out of the above fund will be used for payment of the admission fee of students of commerce for the 3rd semester onwards, and 40% of interest will be used towards payment for the purchase of books for students from any discipline.

Fee Concession

Staff Association Student Welfare Fund

As per ordinance XV-B of the University of Delhi, the following shall amount to acts of gross indiscipline:

- a. Physical assault, threat to use physical force, against any member of the teaching and non-teaching staff of the Institution/Department and against any student within the University of Delhi.
 - b. Carrying/use of, or threat to use any weapon.
 - c. Any violation of the provisions of the Civil Rights Protection Act. 1976.
 - d. Violation of the status, dignity and honor of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes/OBC.
 - e. Any practice-whether verbal or otherwise derogatory to women.
 - f. Any attempt at bribing and corrupting in any manner.
 - g. Wilful destruction of institutional property, including defacing of premises.
 - h. Creating ill-will or intolerance on religious or communal grounds.
- Causing disruption in any manner of the academic functioning of the University system.

Warning

Any student found indulging in any act of indiscipline, using mobile speaker phone or headphone, smoking or consuming tobacco, pan, pan masala, gutkha etc. shall be issued warning and his/her identity card shall be punched. This would comprise the first warning. If the act is repeated, the second warning would be communicated to parents by registered post and the I-Card would be punched second time. A third-time repetition would warrant expulsion from the college.
