A Legacy of 300 Years

The journey of Zakir Husain Delhi College started as the Oriental College for Literature, Science and Art. In 1825, the institution was renamed Delhi College by the British East India Company's government. In 1828, the college added a new course of study in English language, literature and science. Hence, apart from preserving traditional systems of knowledge, Delhi College was one of the pioneers in offering English education in the country, providing a constructive engagement between the oriental and western intellectual traditions, particularly before the 1857 revolt. The college answered to the needs of the city by providing a distinctly diverse cultural ambience that cherished composite culture and a spirit of mutual accommodation. By the early twentieth century it became the centre of vibrant scientific and literary intellectual activities that would be referred to as the 'Delhi Renaissance'. In 1842, the college shifted to Dara Shikoh's library near Kashmiri Gate and the Delhi College Translation Society was set up as its adjunct in 1843.

After the revolt of 1857 in which the revolutionaries plundered the college, the institution passed through many vicissitudes. The British authorities closed the institution after the revolt. Between 1864 and 1871 intermediate Bachelor of Arts and Master of Arts classes commenced. However, the British government transferred the Delhi Oriental College to Lahore in 1877. It was reconstituted as the Anglo-Arabic Intermediate College in 1924. The college was affiliated to Delhi University in 1925 and became one of its constituent degree colleges in 1929. The college was attacked and set on fire by mobs following the partition. Somehow, the library and office records were saved. With the support of Dr. Zakir Husain and others, the Delhi College was revived in 1948. In 1975, the college was renamed Dr. Zakir Husain College to honor his contribution to the institution. In 1986, the college campus was shifted to its present location, Jawaharlal Nehru Marg. The current location of college outside the Turkman Gate geographically and symbolically unites Old Delhi with New Delhi, merging old traditions towards progress and modernity. The Zakir Husain Memorial Trust in its meeting, held in July 2010 and chaired by Hon'ble Prime Minister Dr. Manmohan Singh, unanimously resolved to rename the college as Zakir Husain Delhi College.

In its journey of three centuries, what remains unchanged is the institution's commitment to dissemination of knowledge and the creation of a scientific temper, together with promoting secular and progressive values. The college achieved Grade 'A' from the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in the year 2016 in its very first cycle of assessment. In addition, the institute was awarded the status of DBT-Star college which is a testimony for its unwavering commitment towards imparting scientific knowledge.

Department of Botany

The Botany Department provides a comprehensive study of the plant world under NEP 2020. It offers 4-year UG program to the meritorious students who have qualified class 12 from recognised boards globally. The Department has highly qualified, versatile, committed and experienced teachers who are proficient in their subjects. The faculty uses all modern and traditional pedagogical tools for taking theory and practical classes. Many of them have distinguished themselves in their field of specialization. Department has well lighted, ventilated and spacious laboratories equipped with ICT facilities. Department has tissue culture, microbial culture and instrumentation laboratory. In tissue culture laboratory, students are exposed to plant tissue culture experiments. The Department has a museum “SAMPADA” which has a rich collection of about 5100 plant specimens belonging to 180 families including herbarium. There is also a Botanical Garden in the name of “Janaki Ammal” where aquatic and annual flowering and non-flowering plants are grown for the purpose of conducting practical classes in each semester. During every academic session the Department organises educational trips in Delhi as well as outstation. Department has its reference library. The Department awards scholarships from ‘Harjinder Grover Endowment Fund’ to toppers of B.Sc. (Hons) Botany II year and B.Sc. Life Science II year.

Department of Chemistry

The Department of Chemistry was established in the year 1952. Now, with a team of 23 faculty members and 18 laboratory staff on board, the department has shaped into a centre of excellence in chemistry over the decades. The department boasts of four well equipped laboratories with attached preparation cum balance rooms. In addition to these, there are two instrumentation labs to cater to potentiometry, conductometry, colorimetry, pH-metry and spectrophotometry experiments. The

department offers B.Sc.(H) Chemistry, B.Sc. Physical Sciences and B.Sc. Life sciences courses. In addition, skill enhancement and generic elective courses are offered to students of other departments.

To help students cater to the growing demands of the competitive world, lectures and workshops are held regularly. In addition, the department organizes summer research projects to expose the students to basic tenets of research. Further, industrial visits are organised to enable the students to gain insight into the working of various industries and application of their subject in day-to-day life.

In keeping with the tradition of the department, the S.P. College Facilities

Library and Book Bank

Mirza Mehmood Beg Library is a fully air-conditioned facility with a total collection of around 1,15,000 books. It runs on the Open Access System. It has two Reading Halls with a seating capacity of 100 each. The library also houses two teachers' enclosures having a collective seating capacity of 20, out of which one section is also being used as Enabling Unit for Visually and Print Disabled persons. It also has one room dedicated to the Delhi College Archives, where very old, rare, and historical documents related to the College's history have been kept. The library also has a good collection of rare books and manuscripts. Besides, textbooks and books related to academic requirements, the library also subscribes to leading magazines, leisure books, competitive exams, and general awareness books. The library also houses a Book Bank with a rich collection of around 12,500 books. DHANAK – Western Dance Society

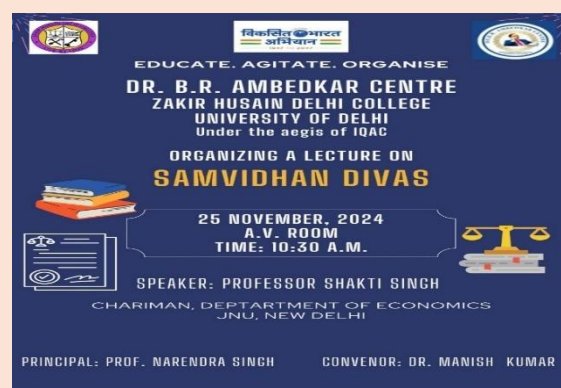

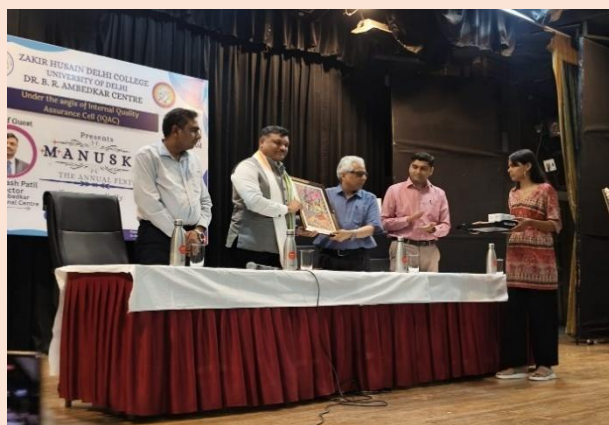

Career Counselling and Placement Cell

The Career Counselling and Placement Cell of Zakir Husain Delhi College, University of Delhi, had a productive and engaging academic year 2024–2025, marked by a range of seminars, workshops, and the successful organization of its annual job and internship fair, VRITI'25. These initiatives were designed to enhance students' employability, communication skills, and real-world readiness.

The year began with a seminar on “Public Speaking and Case Study” on October 18, 2024, conducted by Mr. Amit Poddar, Senior Regional Head at T.I.M.E. Mr. Poddar shared his insights on effective public speaking, confidence-building, and interview performance. He introduced the S.P.E.L.T. framework (Social, Political, Economic, Legal, and Technological analysis) to help students structure their responses during interviews. The session also covered case study analysis, encouraging students to think critically, collaborate on problem-solving, and apply practical frameworks in real-world business scenarios.

On February 21, 2025, a seminar on “Logical Reasoning for MBA Entrance Exams” was held, featuring Mr. Navneet Anand, Business Head at Career Launcher, Delhi. The session highlighted the importance of logical and critical reasoning for both competitive exams and corporate life. Using interactive exercises and real-world analogies, Mr. Anand demonstrated how reasoning and decision-making play a crucial role in interviews, corporate strategy, and everyday problem-solving.

The Cell also organized a session on “Digital Marketing” on February 27, 2025, led by Mr. Ayush Tandon, a digital marketing expert with vast experience in social media strategy and online branding. He introduced students to essential concepts such as content creation, SEO, inbound marketing, and platform-specific branding approaches. The session was interactive and informative, offering practical insights into the growing digital economy and encouraging students to explore career options in this fast-evolving field.

Another key seminar, “Let's Crack an Interview,” was conducted by Ms. Gazal Munjal from IMS Proschool on March 21, 2025. The session provided hands-on guidance on crafting effective resumes and cover letters, understanding interview dynamics, and presenting oneself confidently in front of recruiters. Special focus was given to ATS (Applicant Tracking System) compliance and differentiating between fresher and experienced interview approaches.

The highlight of the year was VRITI'25 – the Annual Job and Internship Fair, held on March 26, 2025. With participation from over 45 companies and more than 1200 students, the event offered diverse roles in areas such as marketing, HR, business development, technology, finance, social service, and education. The fair involved extensive coordination, professional outreach, and meticulous planning by the Placement Cell team, including logistics, stall setup, branding, and scheduling interviews. Students participated enthusiastically, engaging with recruiters, submitting resumes, and attending interviews, while companies appreciated the professionalism and preparedness of the candidates.

In conclusion, the Career Counselling and Placement Cell played a pivotal role in preparing students for the evolving job market. Through a combination of industry-led seminars and hands-on placement opportunities, the Cell helped bridge the gap between academic learning

and professional expectations. The year 2024–2025 stands out for its quality of events, industry participation, and student engagement, reaffirming the Cell's commitment to empowering students in their career journeys.

Enactus

Ateera promotes sustainable livelihood through handcrafted, eco-conscious candles, including new variants such as coffee candles, beeswax products, and essential oil-infused designs. By offering skill training to women, Ateera has fostered both environmental awareness and economic empowerment. Qumash is a fashion-forward upcycling venture that repurposes discarded clothing into Gen Z-inspired apparel and lifestyle products. At the Diwali Fest held at Ramjas College on October 21, 2024, Enactus ZHDC showcased products from Kaagad, Ateera, and Qumash. Further, at the DU Literature Festival held at Sri Ram College of Commerce from February 21 to 23, 2025, the team engaged with an audience of over 1000 attendees, including renowned journalist Rajdeep Sardesai, effectively amplifying the reach and impact of their mission. The society participated in the Enactus Nationals held on July 13, 2024. In partnership with NSS ZHDC, a clothes donation drive was organized during Daan Utsav from October 7 to 9, 2024. The society further collaborated with Enactus Shyam Lal College, participating in their flagship event Anvesha on February 27, 2025. 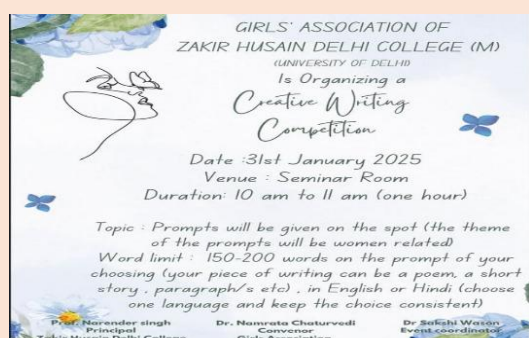

Stock verification was completed with no loss reported due to strict access control. Additional highlights included a Book Exhibition on India's Independence and extensive outreach via digital platforms. The College Librarian and the library staff participated in national and international workshops, while monthly in-house training sessions were conducted for staff development and skill enhancement.

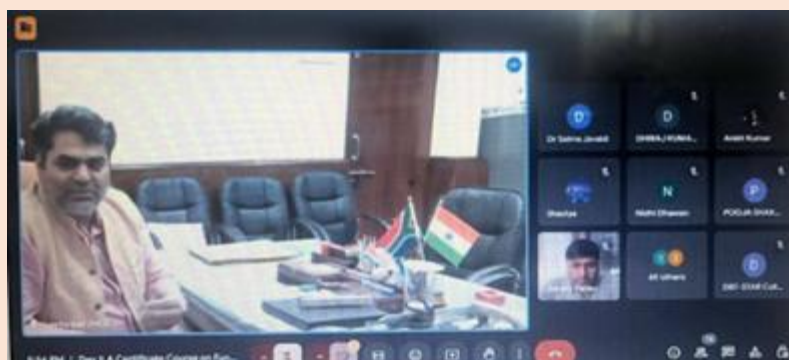

Certificate Course: Fundamentals of A.I. Optimization: Techniques for Efficient Learning

In response to the growing importance of artificial intelligence and data science, the SDLC also launched a Certificate Course titled “Fundamentals of A.I. Optimization: Techniques for Efficient Learning”, a concise 10-hour module curated to introduce students to key optimization techniques in machine learning, on 11th March 2025. The course, coordinated by Dr. Dhiraj Kumar Singh from the Department of Mathematics, served as an accessible starting point for those interested in AI, equipping them with the foundational tools to understand algorithmic efficiency and real-world applications. A total of 83 students from across India enrolled in the AI Optimisation Certificate Course, reflecting its national reach and growing interest in applied artificial intelligence.



Certificate Course: Foundations of Machine Learning

A comprehensive 40-hour certificate course on the Foundations of Machine Learning was launched on 18th March 2024 for UG/PG students, Research scholars, and Faculties by

coordinator Dr. Dhiraj Kumar Singh, Department of Mathematics, ZHDC. This course was designed to provide participants with a solid understanding of essential concepts, hands-on experience, and the ability to apply machine-learning techniques to real-world scenarios. Prof. Shikha Mehta, the Department of Computer Science Engineering at Jaypee Institute of Information Technology, Noida; Dr. Sanjay Yadav, University of People, United States; Dr. Pravesh Kumar, Department of Mathematics, Rajkiya Engineering College, Bijnor and Dr. Vikas Mittal, School of Computer and Systems Sciences, Jawaharlal Nehru University were the course experts.

Certificate Course: Counselling Skills

The SDLC launched a Certificate Course in Counselling Skills on March 7, 2025. Dr. Nisha Jaiswal, Department of Psychology, is the coordinator of the course. This course is aimed at developing essential counselling competencies such as active listening, empathy, effective communication, and ethical practices. It is particularly designed for students and professionals in fields like psychology, education, social work, and other areas that involve interpersonal support. A total of 74 students from across India enrolled in the program, reflecting strong national interest in practical counselling training.



Certificate Course: R.O. Servicing and Assembly

One of the key highlights of this academic year was the launch of a Certificate Course in R.O. Servicing and Assembly on 18th November 2024 in collaboration with Samarth Bharat. This course aimed to provide students with hands-on training in water purification technologies, focusing on the assembly, maintenance, and servicing of Reverse Osmosis (R.O.) systems. The course was jointly coordinated by Mr. Abhinav Singh Katiyar (Department of Psychology), Dr. Manish Kumar (Department of Electronics), and Dr. Bhupender Kumar (Department of Commerce), bringing together expertise from diverse academic backgrounds to offer a holistic learning experience.

INNOQUEST: Design Thinking and Innovation

Adding to these impactful initiatives, the SDLC organized a one-day workshop titled “INNOQUEST: Design Thinking and Innovation” on 26th November 2024. The workshop featured esteemed speakers Prof. Ravinder Kaur and Prof. Naveen Rampal, who introduced students to the principles of design thinking and its relevance in creative problem-solving across disciplines. The session encouraged participants to adopt human-centered approaches, explore innovation in real-world contexts, and develop prototypes for social and entrepreneurial impact.

Certificate Course: Korean Language

The Skill Development Learning Centre (SDLC) at Zakir Husain Delhi College (ZHDC), University of Delhi, in collaboration with the Busan University of Foreign Studies (BUFS), Republic of Korea, has launched a Certificate Course in Korean Language. This initiative marks a significant step in promoting cross-cultural academic exchange and enhancing global

competencies among students. Dr. Sonu Trivedi is the course coordinator. The course aims to provide foundational proficiency in the Korean language, with a focus on practical communication skills, cultural understanding, and linguistic competence. It is designed for beginners and will be jointly certified by ZHDC and BUFS, adding value to the academic credentials of the participants. This joint certification program reflects ZHDC's commitment to skill development and international cooperation, aligning with India's growing strategic and educational ties with South Korea.



Certificate Course: Bioinformatics

An Add-on 30 hours online Certificate Course on ‘Basics to advances in Bioinformatics’ was organized by Skill Development and Learning Centre, Zakir Husain Delhi College. Dr. Tabassum Jehan and Dr. Ruchi Vir from Department of Botany were the course coordinators. It was held from 16 – 27 June 2025. The course aimed to provide foundational knowledge and hands-on experience in bioinformatics tools, databases, and computational techniques used in modern biological research. It was designed for students, researchers, and faculty members engaged in genomics, proteomics, and molecular biology. The course was attended by 70 participants that included undergraduate students, post graduate students, research scholars (Ph.D) and faculty across different universities in the country. Hands-on sessions were conducted using platforms such as NCBI, EMBL-EBI, UniProt, PDB, MEGA, and software tools like Clustal Omega, PyMOL, Cytoscape, STRING etc.



Certificate Course: Data Handling Using Statistical Softwares

The Skill Development and Learning Centre (SDLC) launched a 30-hour online certificate course titled "Data Handling Using Statistical Software: From Analysis to Presentation" on 19th July 2025, running until 5th October 2025. The course is being coordinated by Dr. Savinder Kumar and Dr. Zeeshan from the Department of Botany. Designed to build a strong foundation in data analytics, the course covers statistical software tools essential for data-driven decision-making across various sectors. With over 140 participants, including students, PhD scholars, and faculty members, the course is conducted exclusively on weekends to offer maximum flexibility. It features expert lectures from renowned institutions such as the National Institute of Health (USA), Cedars Sinai Medical Center (USA), University of Bonn (Germany), University of Delhi, BHU, and University of North Bengal. This carefully curated course not only offers practical exposure to data handling and analysis but also fosters interdisciplinary learning and collaboration, making it a valuable addition to the professional development of participants.



Throughout the year, the SDLC has continued to play a pivotal role in complementing formal education with practical, skill-based learning. With its multidisciplinary approach, dedicated faculty, and focus on emerging areas, the Centre has significantly contributed to enhancing the employability and personal growth of the student community. Looking ahead, the SDLC aims to expand its offerings, forge new collaborations, and continue evolving as a cornerstone of professional development at Zakir Husain Delhi College.

Sports Advisory Committee

The newly renovated sports ground of Zakir Husain Delhi College was inaugurated on 22nd January 2025 by Prof. Balram Pani, Dean of Colleges, University of Delhi. In athletics, Himanshu Lohchab was a standout performer, winning three gold medals in long jump, triple jump, and 60m hurdles at the Dr. Bharat Ram Sports Meet. He also secured gold in long jump at FOYS (SRCC) and added further accolades at the Delhi University Inter-College competitions and Delhi State Athletics Championships. The college basketball team made significant appearances in numerous tournaments including the KMC Invitational, AGAAZ (Maitreyi College), Hobnob (JMC), and the prestigious YMCA



Invitational. The team also competed in the DU Inter-College Tournament. Notably, one player won 2nd place at the Dball League, and another was awarded Best Defender at Bennett University. In chess, the team earned 4th position at Desportivos (LNMIT) and 6th at FOYS (SRCC). Individual team members also achieved ranks in national events, including 3rd place at Hourglass 4.0 and 7th place at Coherence Chess. The cricket team qualified for the semifinals in the Maharishi Premier League 2025 and reached the knockout stage in the Delhi University Inter-College Cricket Tournament. The football team also actively participated in major events such as Hobnob, Stricker's Cup, and the Dr. Bharat Ram Sports Meet, with one player securing 3rd position in the Inter-University Games (North West Zone) hosted by Pratap University. In judo, the college earned three bronze medals in different weight categories (under 57kg, 52kg, and 48kg) at the Dr. Bharat Ram Sports Meet. The kho-kho team maintained a strong presence by securing positions at FOYS (3rd), Athleema (5th), and Spardha (3rd). The table tennis team had an exceptional year, winning gold at DESPORTIVOS 2025 and silver at FOYS, Dr. Bharat Ram Sports Meet, and Hobnob (JMC). Harshul Kweera notably won gold in singles at APARAJIT 2025 (Symbiosis Law School) and also competed in the UTT National Ranking Table Tennis Championships 2024. Lastly, the volleyball team secured first position at Khelo Zakir, an event organized by Team Bhalothia, and also represented the college at the Dr. Bharat Ram Sports Meet.

B.A. (Hons.) Arabic

In this program, the students will learn the Arabic script in the first stage, which may include recognition, reading and writing of the Arabic Alphabet. After having learned the script, s(he) will be able to read short and simple sentences in Arabic; with an advanced course s(he) will excel in understanding the Arabic Text. Students will be able to learn Arabic Grammar which will help in improving reading and writing skills and thus enhance their language performance. Due attention is given to Classical/Modern Arabic Literature. The candidate will get an overview of the Classical / Modern Arabic language and be able to talk and write about various social and economic issues in the Arabic language. The curriculum also focuses on English-Arabic-English translation of simple political, socioeconomic, and cultural topics keeping in view the increasing demand in day-to-day life.

Program Specific Eligibility

Candidates must appear in CUET in any of the following subject combinations:

Combination I: Any one Language from List A + Any three subjects from List B

OR

Combination II: Any two Languages from List A + Any two subjects from List B

Merit will be based on the best CUET score obtained from any of the above-mentioned combinations of subjects.

B.A. (Hons.) Bengali

The B.A. (Hons.) Bengali program seeks to cover critical areas of study, i.e., historical and descriptive study of the language; study of the language for specific purposes, such as Film Script, advertisement, official writing, creative writing, translation, journalistic writing, writing for New Media, etc. The study of specific areas like Manuscriptology, Teaching Methodology, the study of the theories of literature and criticism, and the study of the history and important literary texts of Bengali Literature are a part of the program.

Program Specific Eligibility

Candidates must appear in CUET in any of the following subject combinations:

Combination I: Bengali from List A + Any three subjects from List B

OR

Combination II: Bengali and one Language from List A + Any two subjects from List B

OR

Combination I: Any one Language from List A + Any three subjects from List B

OR

Combination II: Any two Languages from List A + Any two subjects from List B

Merit will be based on the best CUET score obtained from any of the above-mentioned combinations of subjects.

Candidates who opted for Combination III and IV for admission will be considered only if seats remain vacant after considering all the candidates who opted for Combination I and II.

B.A. (Hons.) English

The program of B.A. (Hons.) in English helps students to analyze, appreciate, understand and critically engage with literary texts written in English, approaching them from various perspectives and with a clear understanding of locations. It aims to equip students to qualify for joining a profession or to provide development opportunities in particular employment settings. Graduates are enabled to enter a variety of jobs or to continue academic study at a higher level.

Program Specific Eligibility

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

Combination I: English from List A + Any three subjects from List B

OR

Combination II: English and one language from list A + Any two subjects from list B

Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from any of the above-mentioned combination of subjects

B.A. (Hons.) Hindi

This program familiarizes the students of Hindi with a wider understanding of the ability of the language, as well as develops the ability to connect them in the context of the challenges of society locally as well as globally. It also facilitates a new understanding of Hindi literature and practicality of the language and professional competence.

Program Specific Eligibility

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

Combination I: English from List A + Any three subjects from List B

OR

Combination II: English and one language from list A + Any two subjects from list B

Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from any of the above-mentioned combination of subjects

B.A. (Hons.) Persian

This program is designed to inculcate and equip the students with three major components of Persian Language and Literature and Persianate culture, including the Indo-Persianate culture, the vital portion of our secular heritage. With these, a student becomes a responsible civilian and well equipped to meet the growing demand for this language in south Asian studies, which is becoming a fast-growing discipline in many major universities at the world level. For promoting the functional aspect of the various teaching modes, like practical classes in language labs and holding spoken language symposiums and interpretation sessions are conducted.

Program Specific Eligibility

Candidates must appear in CUET in any of the following subject combinations:

Combination I: Any one language from List A + Any three subjects from List B

OR

Combination II: Any two Languages from List A + Any two subjects from List B

Merit will be based on the best CUET score obtained from any of the above-mentioned combinations of subjects.

B.A. (Hons.) Sanskrit

This program aims at getting the students acquainted with the general outlines of Classical Sanskrit Literature (Poetry) through classical texts, develop a fair idea of the works of great Sanskrit poets, appreciate the styles and thoughts of individual poets focusing on the poetical, artistic, cultural and historical aspects of their works. This program will enhance competence in chaste classical Sanskrit and give them skills in translation and interpretation of poetic works.

Program Specific Eligibility

Candidates must appear in CUET in any of the following subject combinations:

Combination I: Any one Language from List A + Sanskrit from List A + Any two subjects from List B

OR

Combination II: Sanskrit from List A + Any three subjects from List B1

OR

Combination III: Any one Language from List A + Any three subjects from List B

OR

Combination IV: Any two Languages from List A + Any two subjects from List B

Merit will be based on the best CUET score obtained from any of the above-mentioned combinations of subjects. Candidates who opted for Combination III & IV for admission will be considered only if seats remain vacant after considering all the candidates who opted for Combination I, II

B.A. (Hons.) Urdu

Urdu Literature in the Urdu language has a history that is inextricably tied to the development of Urdu, the register of the Hindustani language written in the Perso-Arabi script. While it tends to be dominated by poetry, especially the verse forms of the ghazal and nazm, it has expanded into other styles of writing, including that of the short story or afsana. The curriculum of B. A. (Hons.) Urdu offers three major components of Urdu Language and Literature and composite culture, which include the Ganga Jamuna Tehzeeb, the vital portion of our secular heritage. With these, a student becomes a responsible civilian and well equipped to meet the growing demand for this language in south Asian studies, which is becoming a fast-growing discipline in many major universities at the world level.

Program Specific Eligibility

Candidates must appear in CUET in any of the following subject combinations:

Combination I: Urdu from List A + Any three subjects from List B

OR

Combination II: Urdu and one Language from List A + Any two subjects from List B

OR

Merit will be based on the best CUET score obtained from any of the above-mentioned combinations of subjects. Candidates who opted for Combination III & IV for admission will be considered only if seats remain vacant after considering all the candidates who opted for Combination I, II

B.A. (Hons.) Psychology

Through this program, the students get an opportunity to understand and learn the historical influences of psychology as a discipline. The curriculum addresses the fast-paced changes in the subject matter. The curriculum and pedagogy of Psychology are sensitive to the advances in the knowledge, application, and research possibilities in Psychology. The undergraduate coursework in Psychology touches upon the diverse areas of the discipline, including biopsychology, cognitive psychology, history of psychology, research methods, social psychology, Industrial/Organizational psychology, counseling psychology, health psychology and others.

Combination I: Any two Languages from List A + Any two subjects from List B

Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.

B.A. (Hons.) Economics

The B.A. (Hons.) Economics curriculum offers a rigorous basis for much of the advanced thinking in the Economics discipline. It provides the student with a logical paradigm for conceptualizing and interpreting the behavior and interactions of households, firms, and government institutions. The curriculum allows students to choose elective courses from a set of courses with contemporary relevance, thereby offering students the flexibility to prepare for careers in academia, law, management, journalism, government, and many other fields. The program is consistent with global standards in the Economics discipline. It offers training comparable to that of an undergraduate student at the world's best universities.

Program Specific Eligibility

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

Combination I: Any one Language from List A + Mathematics/Applied Mathematics + Any two subjects from List B

Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.

B.A. (Hons.) History

The program offers to inculcate the graduate attributes such as well-being, emotional stability, critical thinking, social justice, and employability skills. B.A. (Hons.) History offers students access to recent historiography in the field organized in a pedagogical form that is accessible and interesting. It is structured for students in an interdisciplinary program, providing them with a concise and thorough introduction to the discipline of History and remaining sensitive to the cognate discipline that they are also studying. It seeks to provide multiple points of intersection with disciplines in the Humanities and the Social Sciences to open communication modes by which a historical sensibility can be an enriching experience.

Program Specific Eligibility

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

Combination I: Any one Language from List A + Any three subjects from List B

OR

Combination I: Any two Languages from List A + Any two subjects from List B

Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.

B.A. (Hons.) Philosophy

The B.A. (Hons.) Philosophy program is an attempt to introduce and provide an in-depth look into one of the most challenging subjects that one can study. It introduces the student to the great philosophers and their ideas and how one thinks about contemporary problems through the lens of their theories. It gives a comprehensive sweep of Indian and Western philosophy and makes students aware of the main currents of thought in ethics. Students also explore Philosophy of Science, Logic, Feminism and Bio-ethics, amongst many other core and optional papers. The core idea is to make the students aware of the foundational issues related to the world around us, whether in our life, or regarding mind and matter, or existence, or belief, or religion or science.

Program Specific Eligibility

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

Combination I: Any one Language from List A + Any three subjects from List B

OR

Combination I: Any two Languages from List A + Any two subjects from List B

Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.

B.A. (Hons.) Political Science

This program aims to expose the students to the way the questions of politics are posed and to critically pose questions on the existence in society. By introducing the philosophers from different traditions, students can answer a few fundamental political questions such as Why do we live in political communities? What is the 'best' form of government? How human nature influences political decision-making? How and in what circumstances do we need to resist bad rulers? By the end of the program, students can understand the idea of modernity and establish a connection between societal changes posed through modernity and its prescribed political suggestions.

B.Sc. (Hons.) Botany

The B.Sc. (Hons.) Botany curriculum offers the essential knowledge and technical skills to study plants holistically. Students would be trained in all areas of plant biology using a unique combination of core and elective papers with significant interdisciplinary components. Students would be exposed to cutting-edge technologies currently used in the study of plant life forms, their evolution and interactions with other organisms within the ecosystem. Students would also become aware of the social and environmental significance of plants and their relevance to the national economy.

Program Specific Eligibility

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

Physics + Chemistry + Biology/Biological Studies/Biotechnology/Biochemistry

Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.

Candidates must appear in any one language from List A in CUET.

B.Sc. (Hons.) Chemistry

The BSc (Hons.) Chemistry curriculum offers courses in inorganic, organic, physical, materials and analytical. The courses will train students with sound theoretical and experimental knowledge that suits the need of academics and industry. The program also offer ample skills to pursue research such as a career in chemistry and allied areas. This program is offered by one of the largest and oldest Departments in the country to produce the best minds to meet the demands of society. BSc (Hons.) Chemistry will help students make an informed decision regarding the goals they wish to pursue in

further education and life.

Physics + Chemistry + Mathematics/Applied Mathematics**

**Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.
Candidates must appear in any one language from List A in CUET.**

B.Sc. (Hons.) Electronics

The B.Sc. (Hons.) Mathematics program covers the full range of mathematics, from classical Calculus to Modern Cryptography, Information Theory, and Network Security. The program lays a structured foundation of Calculus, Real & Complex analysis, Abstract Algebra, Differential Equations (including Mathematical Modelling), Number Theory, Graph Theory, and C++ Programming exclusively for Mathematics.

B.Sc. (Hons.) Zoology

Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects. Candidates must appear in any one language from List A in CUET

B.Sc. (Prog.) Life Science

This program will offer students to acquire comprehensive knowledge of disciplinary subjects along with allied subjects of Biological Science, which will help students to understand and appreciate the diversity of life processes existing in the world as well as their evolutionary aspects. In addition, the program will develop the skills to handle research equipment and computational tools like genomics, meta genetics and gain knowledge in designing holistic public health strategies for social welfare.

Chemistry + Physics + Biology/Biological Studies/Biotechnology/Biochemistry

B.Sc. (Prog.) Physical Science with Chemistry

B.Com. (Hons.)

B.Com. OR

Combination III: Any one Language from List A + Any one subject from List B + General Aptitude Test

Merit will be based on the best CUET score obtained from any of the above-mentioned combinations of subjects.

Note: As the weightage of the CUET Sections is not the same, appropriate proration will be done.

B.A. (Program) combination, where Mathematics/Statistics/Computer Applications/Computer Science is one of the two core disciplines, it is mandatory that the candidate must have studied and passed Mathematics in Class XII examination. Similarly, wherever a Language is being offered as one of the two disciplines, the candidate must have a working knowledge of that Language.

Scholarships and Awards

Mirza Mahmood Beg Memorial Scholarship

Three scholarships of the value of Rs. 1400 each are awarded annually to the undergraduates who secure the highest percentage of marks in the college at the final year University examination in:

- (1) Humanities and Social Sciences stream including Psychology but excluding Mathematics
- (2) Science stream including B.A. & B.Sc. (Hons.) courses in Mathematics
- (3) Commerce stream

Sri Narain Nigam Memorial Scholarship

There are three scholarships for the following categories of students obtaining the highest percentage of marks in the college at the second-year University examination,

- (1) Rs. 700 for a visually handicapped student
- (2) Rs. 1100 for Humanities and Social Sciences stream including Psychology and Commerce stream but excluding B.A. (Hons.) Mathematics
- (3) Rs. 1100 for Science stream including B.A./B.Sc. (Hons.) in Mathematics

Ved Kumar Gupta Memorial Scholarship

One scholarship of the value of Rs. 1100 to a student securing the highest percentage of marks in college at the second year B.A. (Hons.) University examination in Political Science.

Kumar Shubham Memorial Scholarship

Four scholarships for the following categories of II year students who obtain highest percentage of marks in the following courses:

- (1) Rs. 700 for a student in B.A. (Hons.) Psychology
- (2) Rs. 350 for a student in Humanities & Social Sciences stream excluding psychology and B.A. (Hons.) Mathematics
- (3) Rs. 350 for a student in Science stream including B.A./B.Sc. (Hons.) courses in Mathematics
- (4) Rs. 350 for a Commerce Student

All India Entrance Scholarships

The University of Delhi conducts a competitive examination in the month of October for awarding scholarships of the value of Rs. 250 per month for three years. The first-year students admitted to Bachelor with Honours Courses may appear for this examination. They may contact examination Branch VII, University of Delhi, on any working day between 9.30 a.m. and 12.30 p.m. after 1st August.

Mrs. Harjinder Grover Memorial Award

The Botany Department awards a cash prize of Rs. 500/- each to the students securing the highest marks in B.Sc. (Honours) in Botany Semester IV and B.Sc. Life Sciences Semester IV. The prize money is funded by the “Harjinder Grover Endowment Fund” which was instituted in the memory of Late Dr. (Mrs.) Harjinder Grover who remained on the faculty of the department for a long time.

Shobha and Ravindra Nath Kaul Memorial Prize

A memorial prize was instituted in 2021, by Prof. Ratnum Kaul Wattal, Department of Botany in the memory of her parents. Out of the interest generated on the seed money an amount of Rs

2500/- each is given to the topper of B. Sc. (Hons) Botany and B. Sc life Science 3rd year every year. The cash prize is accompanied with a certificate.

S.P. Suri Memorial Award

The Chemistry Department awards every year a medal, books and certificate to the students securing first position in B.Sc. (Hons.) in Chemistry I, II & III year in the college. The award is instituted in the memory of Late Mr. S.P. Suri who established the Chemistry Department in the College and was on its faculty till 1987.

M.K. Gupta Proficiency Award

The Chemistry Department also gives proficiency awards to the students of B.Sc. (Hons.) Chemistry I, II, & III year who secure I, II and III position in the college. The award has been instituted by Late Dr. M. K. Gupta who was an Associate Professor in the Chemistry Department.

Gopa Dey Memorial Award

Bengali department has started Gopa Dey Memorial Award of Rs. 1500/-, Rs. 1000/- and Rs. 500/- each for the students of B.A. (Hons.) in Bengali II and III year who secure first, second & third position in the college. The department will also award Rs. 1000/- to the student of B.A. (Hons.) in Bengali II/III year for remarkable performance in sports and or cultural activities.

Vidya Devi Education Fund

A fund of Rs. 5,51,000/- has been created in the year 2015 for the benefit of students of the College belonging to economically weaker sections of the society by Mr. Ashok Kumar Sharma, Department of Commerce in the name of his mother. 60% of the interest accrued out of above fund will be used for payment of admission fee of students of commerce for 3rd semester onwards and 40% of interest will be used towards payment for purchase of books for students from any discipline.

Fee Concession

Rules and Regulations

Maintenance of Discipline among the students

1. All powers relating to discipline and disciplinary action are vested in the Principal.
2. The Principal may delegate all or such powers as he deems proper to the Discipline Committee and to such other persons as he may specify in this behalf.

 - vii. Wilful destruction of institutional property
 - viii. Creating ill-will or intolerance on religious or communal grounds
 - ix. Causing disruption in any manner of the academic functioning of the College and University
 - x. Ragging

Without prejudice to the generality of his / her powers relating to the maintenance of discipline and taking such action in the interest of maintaining discipline as may seem to him/her appropriate, the Principal may in the exercise of his / her powers aforesaid order or direct that any student or students—
 - be expelled; or
 - be, for a stated period rusticated; or
 - be not for a stated period, admitted to a programme or programmes of study in a College, department or Institution of the University; or
 - be fined with a sum of rupees that may be specified; or
 - be debarred from taking a University or College Examination or Examinations for one or more years; or
 - that the result of the student or students concerned in the Examination or Examinations in which he/she or they have appeared be cancelled.
5. These rules may be supplemented, where necessary, by the Principal of the College. Each student shall be expected to provide himself/herself with a copy of these rules. At the time of admission, every student shall be required to sign a declaration that on admission he/she submits himself/herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Principal and College Administration.

Anti-Ragging

Ragging means any act, conduct or practice by which the dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students. It includes individual or collective acts or practices which,

- a) involve physical assault or threat, and/or use of physical force,
- b) violate the status, dignity and honour of women students and the students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes,
- c) expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem;
- d) entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures, and obscene behaviour. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited both within the College premises or any other part of the University of Delhi as well as on public transport. The directives of the University of Delhi, its Acts, Ordinances, and the Guidance of the relevant order of the Supreme Court of India will be strictly adhered to, in all matters related to ragging.

Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt as per Ordinance XV- C of the University.

Warning

Any student found indulging in any act of indiscipline, using mobile speaker phone or headphone, smoking or consuming tobacco, pan, pan masala, gutkha etc. shall be issued warning and his/her identity card shall be punched. This would comprise the first warning. If the act is repeated, the second warning would be communicated to parents by registered post and the I-Card would be punched second time. A third-time repetition would warrant expulsion from the college.

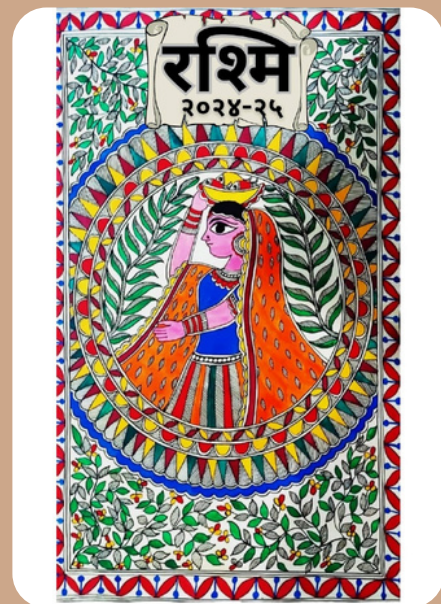
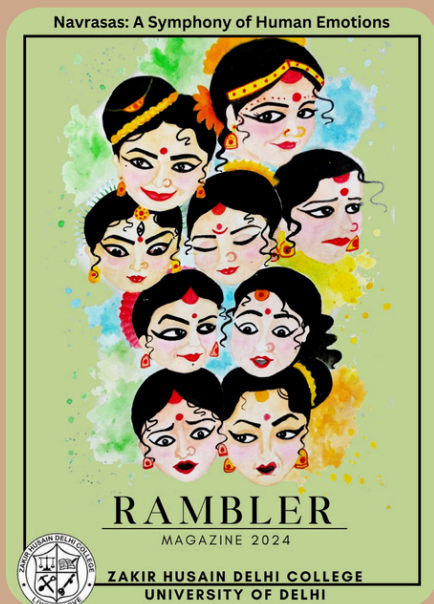
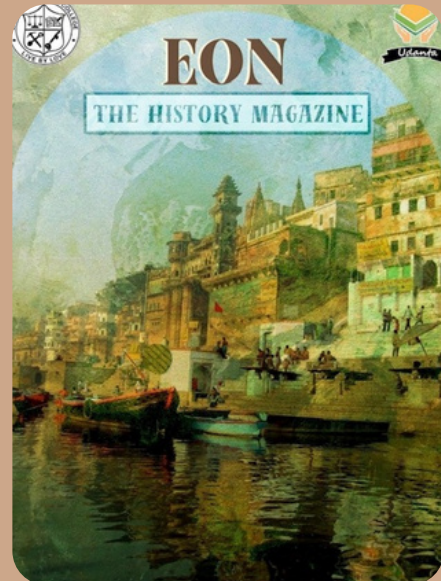
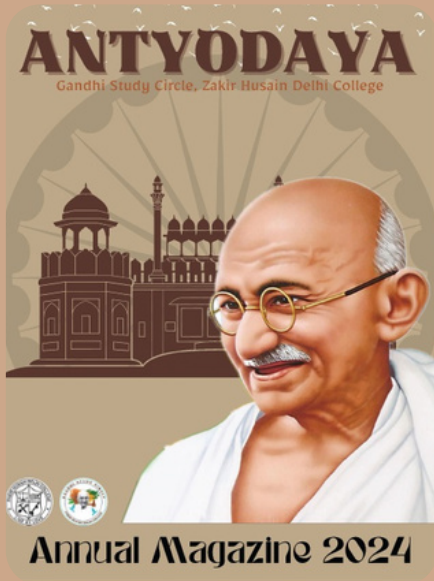
NEP UGCF Flowcharts
