(University of Delhi)



Ramanujan College, a constituent College of the University of Delhi was established in 1958 as an evening college. The College has been accredited Grade “A++” by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in its Second Cycle.

Ramanujan College is felicitated “PRITHVI AWARDS 2024” by ESG Research Foundation in “Global ESG Conference” held on 14th September, 2024 in appreciation of valuable contribution of the College to the Society. Ramanujan college conducts various online courses on ESG Literacy and Sustainability. Ramanujan College offers sixteen undergraduate programmes in different disciplines. Besides this the college has been awarded the DDU KAUSHAL (Deen Dayal Upadhyay – Knowledge Acquisition and Upgradation of Skilled Human Abilities and Livelihood) Kendra (2016) by UGC and Teaching Learning Centre (2017) by the Ministry of Education. The College also offers short-term diploma, certificate, and executive development programmes on contemporary and skill oriented themes to complement the regular graduation courses. It is also the Study Centre of School of Open Learning (SOL), Non- Collegiate Women Education Board (NCWEB) and Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) for various courses

In 2018, the College conducted a Course on Human Rights, Environment and Ethics through its National Resource Centre (NRC), under the Annual Refresher Programme in Teaching (ARPIT) scheme of MoE. The College has also entered into Memorandum of Understanding(s) with foreign universities. It is also working for collaboration with other higher education institutions located in remote areas of the country, under the Vidya Vistar Scheme of the University of Delhi.

Zakir Husain Delhi College

(University of Delhi)



Zakir Husain Delhi College is one of the University of Delhi's leading colleges, offering higher education in Science, Commerce, Humanities, and Social Sciences. The college has the distinction of existing well before the University of Delhi. It has nearly 300 years of history as an institution of learning. The college was affiliated with Delhi University in 1925 and became one of its constituent degree colleges. Following the partition of India, the Delhi College was revived as a nondenominational institution in 1948. It was renamed Zakir Husain College in 1975 and managed by the Zakir Husain Memorial Trust under the Chairmanship of the Prime Minister of India. The present Chairman of Zakir Husain Memorial Trust is our Hon'ble Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi, and the Vice-Chairman is Shri Dharmendra Pradhan, Minister for Education and Skill Development and Entrepreneurship. Today, the college runs undergraduate courses in 21 disciplines and offers 17 postgraduate courses. The solid academic structure is complemented by various societies, giving students a platform to nurture their talents in drama, music, dance, art, and sports. The college features state-of-the-art laboratories, ICT-enabled classrooms, a fully automated, air-conditioned library, and a centrally air-conditioned auditorium. Besides well-maintained lawns and parks, the college houses ecological spaces for students and herbal, rose, and rock gardens (Master Ramchandra Park, Dashrath Manjhi Rock Garden, Lokmata Ahilyabai Holkar Udyan, Dr. Janaki Ammal Botanical Garden and Veerangana Rani Durgavati Garden), which are well-recognized in the Annual Flower Show of Delhi University. Students can also explore their talents and interests in both outdoor and indoor games. This year, in July 2026, a new nine-story building with bright classrooms, state-of-the-art laboratories, and advanced IT infrastructure was added to the existing infrastructure as an expansion facility.

The journey of Zakir Husain Delhi College started as the Oriental College for Literature, Science and Art. In 1825, the institution was renamed Delhi College by the British East India Company's government. In 1828, the college added a new course of study in English language, literature and science. Hence, apart from preserving traditional systems of knowledge, Delhi College was one of the pioneers in offering English education in the country, providing a constructive engagement between the oriental and western intellectual traditions, particularly before the 1857 revolt. The college answered to the needs of the city by providing a distinctly diverse cultural ambience that cherished composite culture and a spirit of mutual accommodation. By the early twentieth century, it had become the centre of vibrant scientific and literary intellectual activity, known as the 'Delhi Renaissance'. In 1842, the college shifted to Dara Shikoh's library near Kashmiri Gate and the Delhi College Translation Society was set up as its adjunct in 1843.

After the 1857 revolt, in which revolutionaries plundered the college, the institution underwent many vicissitudes. The British authorities closed the institution after the revolt. Between 1864 and 1871, intermediate Bachelor of Arts and Master of Arts classes commenced. However, the British government transferred the Delhi Oriental College to Lahore in 1877. It was reconstituted as the Anglo-Arabic Intermediate College in 1924. The college was affiliated with the University of Delhi in 1925 and became one of its constituent degree colleges in 1929. The college was attacked and set on fire by mobs following the partition. Somehow, the library and office records were saved. With the support of Dr. Zakir Husain and others, the Delhi College was revived in 1948. In 1975, the college was renamed Zakir Husain College in honor of his contributions to the institution. In 1986, the college campus was relocated to its current location on Jawaharlal Nehru Marg. The current location of the college, situated outside the Turkman Gate, both geographically and symbolically unites Old Delhi with New Delhi, merging old traditions with progress and modernity. The Zakir Husain Memorial Trust, in its meeting held in July 2010 and chaired by Hon'ble Prime Minister Dr. Manmohan Singh, unanimously resolved to rename the college as Zakir Husain Delhi College.

In its journey of three centuries, what remains unchanged is the institution's commitment to the dissemination of knowledge and the creation of a scientific temper, together with promoting secular and progressive values. The college achieved Grade 'A' from the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in the year 2016 in its very first cycle of assessment. In addition, the institute was awarded the status of DBT-Star college, which is a testimony to its unwavering commitment towards imparting scientific knowledge.

At the end of the programme, participants will be able to: Identify appropriate AI applications for teaching and research; Design AI-enhanced learning resources and classroom activities; Use Generative AI tools effectively for academic and pedagogical purposes; Apply AI-assisted techniques in research and scholarly writing; Develop responsible and ethical AI practices in academic environments; Critically evaluate the opportunities and limitations of AI technologies.
